

WHAT UNITES THE CHURCH

Series: The Book of Acts

The church today in many ways is known for what it is against rather than what it is for. This was the polar opposite of what the church was originally founded on in the book of Acts. This Sunday we unpacked three different ways to work toward unity in the church.

February Spiritual Discipline: Silence

Finish each devotional time with 3 minutes of complete silence asking God, "Lord show me how to "Live Sent" (going into the world sharing you) today."

Weekly Devotional:

2/21 - Acts 26:1-18 - It's powerful how Paul so passionately shares his testimony to try and open up the hearts of the king and his men. What sticks out most to you? Which part of your testimony, of how Jesus has changed you, is most powerful to you?

2/22 - Acts 26:19-32 - These men are clearly perplexed at Paul's rock solid faith, especially after being arrested for it. If you were standing trial for your faith like Paul, and had one last opportunity to speak truth, what would you say?

2/23 - Acts 27:1-26 - This section seems more like "Pirates of the Caribbean" than building the church. But Paul shares God's faithfulness by the end, sharing a word from God. What "shipwrecks" do you see around your life or community that you can pray and ask God for a word for today?

2/24 - Acts 27:27-44 - The commanding officer wanted to spare Paul, his enemy, because Paul added so much value to him and his crew. Name an unbeliever or unchurched person you know and describe how you can "invest" in their life and add value to them in this season.

2/25 - Acts 28 - Nothing could stop Paul from doing his favorite thing in life: sharing Jesus with those who need him. What in this passage about Paul sticks out most to you? What does it mean for you to "live sent" in this season of your life. Have you ever used a Corner Card?

Challenge:

Live Sent. Grab a Corner Card and begin to use it. If you already use one, consider this week how to uniquely practice "Step 3: Invest."
